COLONEL JOHN H. SINGLETON JR.

Col. John H. Singleton is the Commander, 172nd Maintenance Group, Thompson Field, Mississippi. He acts as the primary advisor to the Wing Commander on most issues pertaining to the operation, maintenance and support of the C-17A Globemaster III aircraft assigned to the 172nd Airlift Wing. Additionally, Col. Singleton oversees support and services to the airmen assigned and attached to the 172nd Maintenance Group, including the 172nd Maintenance Squadron, 172nd Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and the 172nd Maintenance Operations Flight. He also serves as the sitting chair for the MXG Weapon System Council for the Air National Guard's C-17 aircraft and is the Director of the Air National Guard Squadron Commanders Training Course at Joint Base Andrews, Maryland.

Col. Singleton enlisted in the Mississippi Air National Guard in 1987 as an Air Transportation Cargo Specialist. He was commissioned through the Academy of Military Science in June 1999 after graduating from Mississippi State University. He served as Commander of the 172nd Aerial Port Flight and Director of Logistics for the 172nd Logistics Readiness Squadron. With his expertise, the senior logistician was selected to lead several Wing level deployment and Air Mobility Command Inspector General related events. During his career, Col. Singleton has deployed in support of Operation Desert Storm, Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom. He served as Commander



of the 172nd Aerial Port Flight and Director of Logistics for the 172nd Logistics Readiness Squadron. Prior to his current assignment, Col. Singleton was the Comptroller for the 172nd Airlift Wing where he effectively managed all federal funds allocated to operate the 172nd Airlift Wing, the Combat Readiness Training Center in Gulfport, Mississippi and two additional geographically separated units.
