COLONEL JOHN H. SINGLETON JR.

Colonel John H. Singleton is the Commander, 172d Maintenance Group, Thompson Field, Jackson, Mississippi. He acts as the primary advisor to the Wing Commander on most issues pertaining to the operation, maintenance and support of the C-17A Globemaster III aircraft assigned to the 172d Airlift Wing. Additionally, Colonel Singleton oversees support and services to the airmen assigned and attached to the 172d Maintenance Group, including the 172d Maintenance Squadron, 172d Aircraft Maintenance Squadron, 172d Maintenance Operations Flight and Maintenance Training Detachment.

Colonel Singleton began his career in 1987 by enlisting in the Mississippi Air National Guard as an Air Transportation Cargo Specialist. He was commissioned at the Academy of Military Science in June 1999 after graduating from Mississippi State University. Colonel Singleton has held various positions throughout the squadron and wing levels of the 172d Airlift Wing. Through his logistics expertise, he was selected to lead several Wing level deployment and Air Mobility Command Inspector General related events. During his career, Colonel Singleton has deployed in support of Operation DESERT STORM, ENDURING FREEDOM and IRAQI FREEDOM. He served as Commander of the 172d Aerial Port Flight and Director of Logistics for the 172d Logistics Readiness Squadron. Prior to his current assignment, Colonel Singleton was the Comptroller for the 172d Airlift Wing where he effectively managed all federal funds allocated to operate the 172d Airlift Wing as well as the Combat Readiness Training Center in Gulfport and two additional geographically separated units.
